Our Stafford office was the first bureau (as it was know then) to open in Staffordshire in November 1939. The very first Citizens Advice opened on 4th September 1939 in response to the outbreak of war. It was set up as a new nationwide advisory service which would help people navigate the uncertainty, chaos and challenges of life during wartime.

For 85 years, Citizens Advice has been helping people find a way forward.

We have grown and changed over the years but our dedication and commitment to our clients

has remained the same.

What a fantastic achievement for a local charity that started with very little and was run by a few volunteers to the organisation we have become today. We now have offices in 5 locations across

# **Case study**

The client is 75 and lives in a shared ownership two bedroom property on her own.

The client is retired. She receives a state pension and a private pension and still works when she can to top up her income.

The client approached CASSW for support in relation to her financial situation and budgeting. Alongside this she wished to receive a benefit check as she was not in receipt of any benefits.

She explained that she was struggling to make ends meet and was concerned about bills which were due and how these would be addressed due to her income not being enough to cover

essential items.

To support the client at the outset a referral was made to Staffordshire Household Support Fund for a **£65** supermarket voucher. This application was accepted.

Following on from this an appointment was made to complete a benefit check. During this appointment it was established that the client was not receiving support which she was entitled to.

This being Housing Benefit of £26.57 weekly and Local Council tax Reduction £14.43 weekly plus Pension Credit £54.75 per week.

### **Our volunteers**

Our volunteers come from all walks of life and choose to volunteer for a variety of reasons. They include students, people getting back into work after career breaks, people with part-time jobs, carers, and people who've retired.
